Read *Romans 12:3-8*

- Paul was writing to Christians living in Rome. Nero was Emperor and he was about to do some very mean things to Christians. Paul knew he was writing to city people who can be very different from each other - tough sailors, well-travel tradesmen, wealthy former idolaters, and slaves were all part of the new church in Rome. He wanted them to see their likeness in Christ with statements like, "All have sinned. All fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23
- Chapters 1 - 8, Paul explains the foundation of the Christian faith, This is why the book is quoted so often in salvation messages.
- Chapters 9 - 11, he explains how people can receive a relationship with God.
- Chapters 12 - 16, Paul explains how to use this information to live a godly life.
