

Ministry Lead Module 5 – Develop Communication Skills to Achieve Goals

Core Competency

Develop communication skills to achieve goals

Objective

This module offers ideas on how to communicate clearly to Coaches and their leaders so that they comprehend, own, transmit, and implement new initiatives that address issues and move the organization forward.

NOTE: A Ministry Lead must craft communication in a way that is portable and can move easily through Coaches, Leaders, team members, and even to individuals those team members serve. Keep this vantage point in mind as you complete the following assignments.

Assignment 1

Read James 3:1-5 and answer the following questions.

James 3:1-5 (MSG)

"Don't be in any rush to become a teacher, my friends. Teaching is highly responsible work. Teachers are held to the strictest standards. And none of us is perfectly qualified. We get it wrong nearly every time we open our mouths. If you find someone whose speech was perfectly true, you'd have a perfect person, in perfect control of life. A bit in the mouth of a horse controls the whole horse. A small rudder on a huge ship in the hands of a skilled captain sets a course in the ace of the strongest winds. A word out of your mouth may seem of no account, but it can accomplish nearly anything -- or destroy it!"

Questions

- 1. This passage points out that the tongue is a dangerous combination of **powerful** and **hard to control**. What are some examples of how failure to control your tongue (in big and small ways) can hinder your ability to educate, motivate and effectively lead your team?
- 2. If "a word out of your mouth may seem of no account, but it can accomplish nearly anything," how might your carefully chosen words, spoken at the right moment, to the right person, lead to significant growth for someone? Do you have a specific example to share?

Questions

1. This chapter covers a lot of ground in less than ten pages. What information did you find most insightful?

2. Can you think of a time when someone took the time to call out the high potential they saw in you? If so, what impact did that encouragement have on your attitude, confidence, and performance?

3. "When individuals have an opportunity to meet both professional and personal needs within the same environment, they often achieve optimum performance." What are some ways you can connect the team's goals with each person's needs, motives, and personal goals?

4. Recognizing people's contributions and celebrating successes is a critically important part of effective communication. What was the most impactful communication you ever received that highlighted an accomplishment of yours?
