Morning Time

To help your kid see the value of small group, talk to them about how it has impacted you. If you're a member of a small group at your church, share a little about what that group means to you. And if you're not, consider joining one to help your kid see that it's something you're interested in figuring out and participating in as well.



Drive Time

Consistency is key for your middle schooler's involvement in small group. So help them be consistent by committing to make sure they get there. Make it a priority to attend church at the same service time every week so your kid is consistently present with the same members of their small group on a regular basis.



Meal Time

One of the biggest struggles a middle school small group can face is finding help with events outside of group time. Help them out by doing what you can to meet that need. Offer to drive some of the kids to a group hangout, open up your home to host special events, or sign up to provide snacks. Do what you can to help more group time happen for your middle schooler.

The most important person in your kid's small group? Their small group leader! Reach out to them this week to thank them for the investment they're making in the lives of middle schoolers. Encourage them with a note, a gift card, or something fun to let them know you see and appreciate them.
