

Week 3, Day 1:

No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other; you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and be enslaved to money.

Matthew 6:24 (NLT)

Following Jesus financially is an intentional decision — it won't happen by accident. Jesus said money is the number 1 competitor for our hearts.
